project, developed MedEquip4Kids in partnership with the University of Bolton, will support young people's mental health by providing emotional wellbeing training in schools across the North West, using the concepts of Positive Psychology such as grit, growth mindsets and identifying unique strengths. It will be delivered by a project worker as well as young people with lived experience of mental health problems.



Andy Burnham said: "There's a growing call from young people for more support with their own mental health and wellbeing, their own resilience, to navigate what is out there an increasingly challenging world. That's why the Hummingbird Project is so right, so of the moment. It's really answering the call coming from young people."

New screen offers privacy for young patients As part of our Manchester Appeal to fund equipment for emergency treatment and support of victims after the Manchester Arena attack, we provided an aquarium-decorated folding screen to create privacy, distraction and a more pleasant environment for young patients at the UHSM Paediatric Emergency Department. The Manchester Appeal is still open for donations.



New equipment for poorly babies at UHSM

Pre-term and poorly babies at the University Hospital of South Manchester's neo natal unit will now have their blood oxygen measured with new pulse oximeters and receive respiration support from a new Fabian Therapy system when their levels drop. A new Bilisoft blanket will allow babies to have parental contact while being treated for jaundice or enable a phototherapy lamp to be used at the same time in severe cases.

A calming space for kids awaiting treatment

The sensory room in the children's unit at North Manchester General Hospital needs updating with equipment including a bubble tube, colour wheel projector, and musical cushion. Play specialist Karen Thompson says: "The sensory room helps calm children down after an invasive procedure, helps children with mental health issues feel calm, and gives them time and a place to think."

Heart monitors babies at Royal Bolton

The neo natal unit at Royal Bolton Hospital is in need of another cardiac monitor for its special care unit. This will be used to care for newborn babies who have recovered enough to leave the intensive care unit, but still require further cardiac monitoring.

Support for children respiratory distress this winter



When children have severe chest infections, asthma or bronchiolitis they often require supplementary oxygen. In winter more children need care for respiratory conditions, meaning the demand for essential equipment increases. The paediatric unit at Macclesfield District General Hospital need two new Airvo Optiflow Systems to ensure effective treatment is readily available. The system features a humidifier which comfortably delivers high flows of air/oxygen mixtures, but is less intensive than other respiratory support systems.



Diver Brown was born seven weeks early at Royal Albert Edward Infirmary weighing just 4lbs 4oz. Oliver spent his first two days in the Intensive Care Unit where he needed a CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure) machine to help him breathe, after which he was transferred to the High

Dependency Unit. For a while he was also in an incubator as his temperature kept dropping and he was jaundiced.

For three weeks, Oliver received excellent round-theclock neo natal care. He's now growing up to be a healthy, happy little boy. His mum Louisa says: "The nursing staff were absolutely brilliant. I couldn't praise the whole

unit enough. Thank you to MedEquip4Kids for all the equipment you've funded in Wigan.'
